

KEY RESEARCH:

- Conley [disclosed](#) that she received salary and consulting income from Primer AI and Hidden Level Inc, totaling over \$328,000 since January 1, 2025.
 - Palantir powers ICE and their deportation machine and Primer AI and Hidden Level both partner with Palantir to enhance their technology and data.
 - Earlier this year, [Politico](#) and [The Intercept](#) both reported on Conley's work for firms partnering with Palantir to support Trump's DHS and ICE.
- Beth Davidson is [standing up to ICE](#) by making sure that Rockland County doesn't coordinate with ICE to go after law-abiding immigrants and American citizens.

Palantir and Primer AI:

- **Starting in 2025, Conley began [earning consulting income](#) from Primer AI.** In August 2025, Conley disclosed she had received \$12,500 in 'consulting' fees from Primer AI. In May 2026, Conley [disclosed](#) she has received \$35,000 in 'consulting' fees from Primer AI since January 1, 2025.
- Primer AI partners with Palantir to bolster Palantir's '[foundry platform](#)', which was adopted by DHS and HHS under the Trump Administration to organize and analyze data, including their increased surveillance and tracking of migrants.
 - Foundry has also reportedly been used by other federal agencies to track U.S. citizens, including gathering IRS data on American citizens.
- **Both [Primer AI](#) and [Palantir's](#) websites mention their active partnership.**
- Beyond their work with Palantir, **Primer AI [partners](#) directly with DHS to support DHS missions** through 'real-time monitoring, explainable analysis, and scalable workflows'.
 - Per website: The Department of Homeland Security faces a constant flow of complex, unstructured data—from border activity reports and field notes to global news and social media. The challenge is turning this information into timely, trusted insight to secure borders, protect critical infrastructure, disrupt criminal networks, and respond to crises. Primer helps homeland security teams close this gap by fusing open-source and internal data, surfacing early signals of risk, and delivering decision-ready intelligence at mission speed. This data sheet outlines how Primer's AI platforms support DHS missions with real-time monitoring, explainable analysis, and scalable workflows tailored to homeland security operations.

Hidden Level and Palantir:

- **In May 2026, Conley [reported](#) receiving \$152,743.07 in salary and \$140,540.08 in 'consulting' fees from Hidden Level since January 1, 2025.**
- Hidden Level is an aerial surveillance company that has [active contracts](#) with the Department of Defense.
- According to its [website](#), **Hidden Level "integrat[ed] its real-time data into the Palantir System"** to track aerial threats for DoD. Hidden Level's technologies are integrated into Palantir's Maven platform, which received a [\\$480 million contract](#) with the Pentagon under Trump.

- On a Palantir earnings call in February 2026, the CTO Shyman Sankar [said](#) usage of Palantir's Maven defense AI platform is at 'all-time highs,' with the system supporting simultaneous real-world military events and being pushed out to more combatant commands and edge environments."
- **Hidden Level Stated That Through This Integration, "Within 48 Hours, Hidden Level's System Was Streaming Live Airspace Data Into Palantir" And "Providing The Exact Same Feed To Federal, State, And Local Law Enforcement."**
- **Hidden Level [stated](#) that its surveillance data was "Live Inside Platforms Like Palantir's Maven."**
- Gizmodo [expands](#) on some of the work Palantir is doing with DoD, including the use of Palantir software in Caribbean boat strikes.

Palantir and ICE under Trump:

- **Palantir powers ICE and their deportation machine.** Since [Trump](#) came into office, DHS and HHS have started using Foundry, a key Palantir product to organize and analyze data.
- **Palantir's federal contracting business has skyrocketed under Trump.** Palantir [received](#) more than \$900 million in federal contracts in 2025, nearly double the amount they received in 2024. Its September tally of new federal contracts was \$128 million, its largest monthly sum on record, according to [USASpending.gov](#).
- **[In April](#), ICE signed a \$30 million contract with Palantir for them to build a platform to track migrants' movements in real time, the Immigration Lifecycle Operating System (ImmigrationOS).** The app has played a key role in supporting the Trump Administration's mass deportation campaign." ICE [renewed](#) the contract on Sept. 25, bringing its total value to about \$60 million.
 - It is likely that PrimerAI's software is being used in these efforts to surveil and track migrants.
 - In a leaked internal Slack [message](#), Akash Jain, Chief Technology Officer of Palantir Technologies and President of Palantir USG, wrote: "Over the last few weeks we prototyped a new set of data integrations and workflows with ICE" and added: "The new administration's focus on leveraging data to drive enforcement operations has accelerated those efforts."
 - ICE [adopted](#) Immigration OS as it rolled out a campaign to identify and detain what it calls the "Worst of the Worst." The agency has cited cases of undocumented immigrants committing serious crimes as justification for broad deportation sweeps through cities such as Chicago, Charlotte, Portland, and Minneapolis.
 - But ICE internal data [leaked](#) to the Cato institute shows that only 5% of people detained by ICE have violent convictions and 73% of those detained by ICE had no criminal convictions whatsoever.
- Palantir's CEO, Alex Karp, used to be a harsh critic of Trump, but has swung rightward in recent years to become a [key supporter](#), specifically [shifting course on immigration](#) and their work with ICE. Palantir's cofounders [Peter Thiel](#) and Joe Lonsdale are long time donors and supporters of Trump.
